

SAVE OUR SPIRE

Our much-loved spire needs your help!







Why does the spire require repair works?

The tower and the spire at St Mary's the Virgin Church were built in 1858 and the cedar shingles used in the spire have not been replaced in the intervening 167 years. A significant deterioration in the spire fabric was first advised in 2007 and now needs to be addressed urgently. The defects and issues now requiring attention include:

Cedar shingles

Heavily weathered with pieces splitting and delaminating Missing, slipped and broken tiles creating gaps for water ingress

Birds and mammals are gaining access and creating further damage

Lead/Leadwork flashing

Critical for water proofing; some flashing is missing, loose, corroded or split

Decorative timberwork

Sections missing, evidence of deterioration and potential rot

Bird mesh

Bird mesh incomplete; need to prevent access to birds and mammals

Clock faces


Clock faces faded

Weathervane

Weathervane faded and rusting

Lightning protection

Loose and non-compliant



How can you help?

We request your help in raising funds for the restoration of the spire, one of our most iconic local landmarks. Work is already underway with our architects, and we will need a further £200,000 to replace the 6,500 shingles at an approximate all-in cost of £30 per shingle. We will use the opportunity to undertake other essential works, including the clock face and weathervane.

Applications for grants are planned from the National Lottery and various church grant schemes and the likelihood of success will be greatly increased by the level of local community support. We are appealing therefore to you, as a local resident, to donate to our Spire Appeal and to get involved in local fundraising.
